- Location:** Tsim Tsui East, 10 minutes' drive from Kowloon station, on the Airport Express Line and at the hub of the city's highly efficient transport network. **Design:** Bright, unfussy and contemporary. The stylish interiors are the works of both local and overseas designers with a selection of Hong Kong artwork evident throughout. The Club Lounge was designed by London based, Conran & Partners who also designed The Market restaurant in the style of a Wanchai market. French botanist Patrick Blanc created the amazing vertical garden on the wall of the lobby. The interiors are complemented with revolutionary technology and intelligent luxuries.

**Guest rooms:** 262 double bedrooms – including 26 suites - with the vast majority of rooms enjoying spectacular views of Victoria Harbour and Hong Kong's skyline. The pièce de résistance is the hotel's Designer Suite by renowned fashion designer and Hong Kong icon, Vivienne Tam.

The **Designer Suite by Vivienne Tam** is personally curated by Vivienne herself and exudes her signature brand of China chic. It takes its inspiration from Shanghai's Art Deco era and the spacious bedroom has an adjoining living room that provides privacy for work or entertaining in style. Design highlights:

**Restaurants and  
Bars:**

- **Above & Beyond** – this 28<sup>th</sup> floor Chinese restaurant, open to all guests, has stunning views of Hong Kong's skyline. It gained three "fork-and-spoons" in the Michelin Guide Hong Kong and featured on Condé Nast Traveller's Hot List "Best New Restaurant: Hotel Tables". Exquisitely prepared dim-sum and authentic Cantonese cuisine is served with a menu of vintage wines from the hotel's private collection. There are three private dining rooms perfect for business meetings and private dinners. Designed by Conran & Partners, any meal here is all about the rare 360-degree view of the harbour and city. The kitchen is located in the heart of the space so all guests, whether in the bar, restaurant, private dining rooms or meeting room, can appreciate the magnificent views. Wine is also a key element of Above & Beyond with a full-height wine wall on display plus a special walk-in wine room with sizeable marble table for tastings.
- **The Market** – a refreshing alternative in Tsim Sha Tsui. The Market is inspired by the iconic food markets of Asia and Europe, with their vibrant atmosphere and abundant fresh produce. It serves international delights from antipasti to laksas and grilled beef. There are also separate sections for the deli, sashimi, Hong Kong, Eastern and Western cuisine and desserts. The Market's private dining room seats 15 people. Also designed by Conran & Partners, The Market wraps around a lovely internal courtyard and has a robust, industrial feel with concrete walls offset with colours and textures reminiscent of Mediterranean deli counters.
- **GREEN** – open all day, Green is a neighbourhood café by day and a vibrant bar by night. It

sits in one of the world's largest indoor vertical gardens, designed by renowned botanist, Patrick Blanc.

- Health & Fitness:** A wide range of health and fitness services, including:
- **Angsana Spa** - with 4 private VIP treatment rooms including one couples' treatment room
  - **Health Club and Fitness Centre** - with the latest Technogym cardiovascular and weight training equipment and panoramic views of Tsim Sha Tsui. There is also a stretching area and personal trainers are available.
  - **Pool Bar** – offering a range of fruit juices, smoothies and healthy snacks as well as the usual selection of beers, wines and spirits.
  - **Heated Outdoor Swimming Pool** - set on the rooftop (Level 9) with wonderful views of Victoria Harbour and the Hong Kong skyline. The sun desk adjoins the pool bar.
- Private Dining, Conferences and Meetings:** Its location, space and full range of audio-visual, lighting and technical facilities means Hotel ICON has plenty of experience in running events. From weddings to conferences, seminars and business meetings, there is something to accommodate everyone. The range of venues can host groups from 8 to 580 and the configuration options are endless. From The Silverbox Ballroom; breakout rooms for executive meetings; to pool deck cocktails; and Private Dining Rooms for round table meetings.
